## Fire Safety

## Consider Running for the Board, Deadline is Wednesday

It's time to consider serving your Market community by running for the Board. The term of service is

eighteen months. The next Board of Directors election is December 12. Four Board positions will be open. To run, you must have attended at least one Board meeting in the 12 months before the election. You have one more chance to complete this requirement, Dec. 6 at 9 AM. Candidate statements are due by this Wednesday, Nov. 25 at 4 pm.

## Office/Market Schedule

The office will be open only on Wednesday next week, from 10 am - 4 pm. The building will be open for set up from 11 am to 7 pm on Wednesday. The building will not be open at all on Thanksgiving. The building will open for vendors at 7 am next Friday.

## Gift Certificates, Holiday Dollars

During the weekend, you may have customers present you with Saturday Market gift certificates, Unique Eugene gift certificates or coupons that say "One Holiday Market Dollar." Please accept them the same as cash from your customer, and give change if needed. You may then redeem the certificates at the Vendor Info Center for the equivalent amount in cash.

## Helpful Hint for New Folks

Remember to let your customers know if this is your only weekend selling, or if you are not coming back until the last three days. Many folks assume that everyone is here all the time and will come looking for you later, so capture those sales today! If you are coming back later, you may want to give them one of the HM postcards (in the Vendor

Center) with your selling dates and contact info.

## Sustainability Efforts

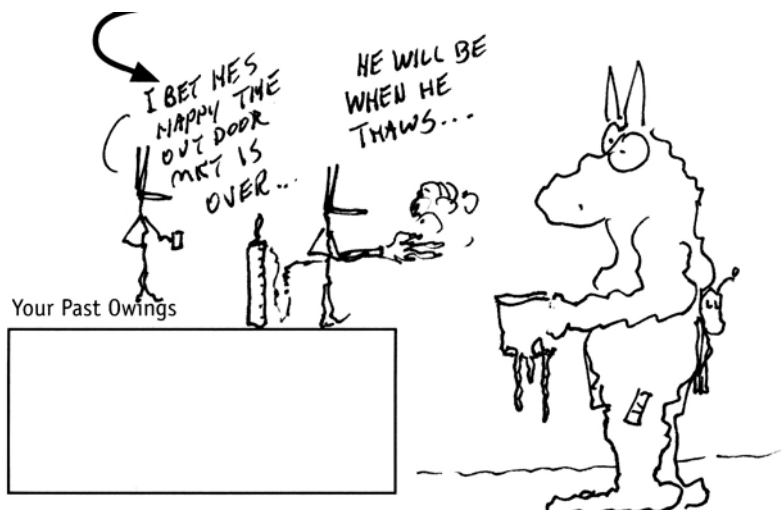
Each year we look forward to the Holiday Market and try to make it the best that we can. Our market is dedicated to getting out the message that we respect the natural systems of the planet which provide for a high quality of life. Like last year, in order to reduce the demand for plastic, we have asked the food booths not to use any plastic forks or spoons.

Here is where you come in. Please deposit any forks or spoons you use in the buckets near each garbage can. Please encourage others to do so as well. Working together, we kept around 4,000 forks per Market day from going into the landfill last year!

We're also continuing another Sustainability effort—like on the Park Blocks, all trash will be sorted into compost, recycleables and garbage. Since space is tight, you won't see as many of the sorting bins as we have on the Park Blocks, but be assured that every bag of trash from every can will be sorted.

## Credit Card Sales

Please follow our tried and true credit card sales process. Use the slips we have provided for this purpose which are available in the vendor service center. Complete the form with your full first and last name, NOT your business name or your boothsitter's name. Guide the customer to the information booth by pointing out the colorful flags. After they return, check their slip. Does it have your name written on the bottom? Check the date and the amount to make sure they are correct and then record the authori-



zation number in your records and give the customer the item, they keep the slip. If the sale was done before 2:30 pm on Sunday the check will be available from 6 pm to 6:30 outside the vendor office. Otherwise, pick it up in the vendor office the following weekend or call us to mail it to you. There is a 5% charge for using the market's credit card service. You may not charge the customer extra. However, you may discount for cash or make a choice not to use the service.
