Final Product Screening

If you have a new product that needs to be approved before Holiday Market, there is only one screening left on Wednesday, Nov. 4 at 4 pm. When you introduce a new product at your booth that is a different kind of product than what you've been selling, you need to get that product approved. This means that if, for example, you make clothing and decide to sell jewelry as well, or make candles and decide to sell soaps, you need to be approved for the new products. If you introduce new designs into your existing product line, you don't need Standards approval.

Lovely, glossy, colorful Holiday Market postcards are now available for you to use, for FREE. It's time to start letting folks know about HM, so please hand them out to customers and mail them to your mailing list. There is room on the back for you to add your booth space or other info. Final Holiday Market Orientation

If you have never sold at Holiday Market before (even if you're a Saturday Market regular), you will need to attend one of our Holiday Market orientations. It is required that marketeers new to Holiday Market attend one of these sessions, to learn basic info that will make your first Holiday Market experience go as smoothly as possible.

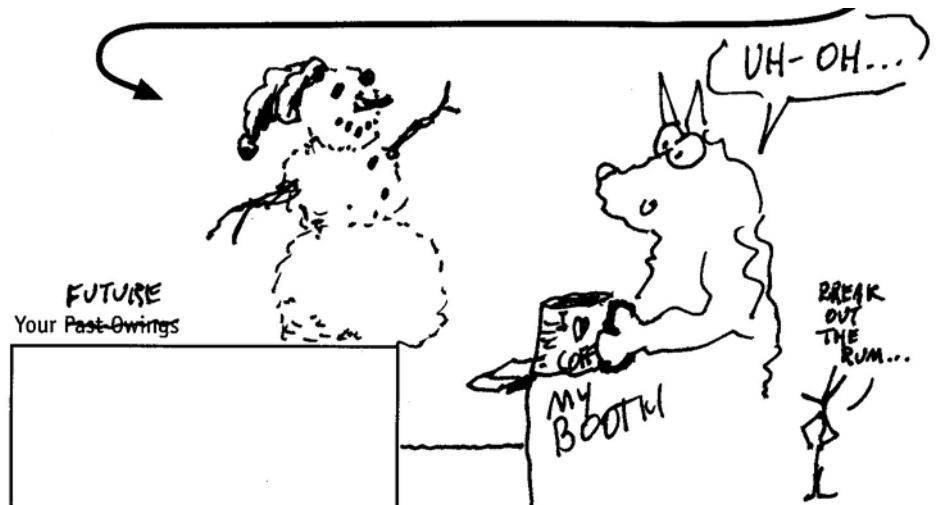
The agony of the 8' aisle
