### How We Got To Holiday Market

Those last outdoor Markets in late fall are always bittersweet but probably no one wants to be there in December now. This was not always our way!

It was not until 1986 that we managed to hold an event at the Fairgrounds, called the New Holiday Market, and it was for one weekend only, all we felt we could afford. It was held Dec. 3-7 and I made as much there as I usually made in six weeks downtown. The following year we were still holding that and the Park Blocks markets at the same time, to be fair to those who didn't have the funds. In 1988 we rented both the Auditorium and the Wheeler Pavilion at the same time with some booths outside in the courtyard, for all of the Saturdays and Sundays in December, and chose spaces in June. Fees were variable, with the 10%, and so was attendance, and in 1989 we added the Thanksgiving weekend. It took until 1993 to make the leap to the Exhibit Hall with a contract that increased the rent every year. That was the year that solidified the event and gave us the winning pattern we still follow.

Selling outdoors until Christmas was always the rule, even in 1970 when the Market grew from 29 in May to 110 members selling at the end. It was always cold and frequently wet. On the Butterfly people would fill a box with newspapers and stand in it to keep warm. At some point propane heaters in individual booths helped make it bearable. Many years were not profitable for the Market, but there were many indoor options for crafters that grew and dissolved, at the Fairgrounds and downtown. We all knew that people didn't really want to shop outside, but the rare pleasant weather and the warm spontaneity of the outdoor markets made it hard to give up, and the membership was determined to stay together.

We tried renting big tents, renting aisle coverings for the public (which were dark and required renting lights as well), having promotional events and lots of advertising, but weather is not something we can ignore. One year (1983) it snowed a foot on our Thanksgiving weekend market. I hauled my booth home on my trailer with my bike on top. Fees were low but so were sales. It has snowed on the Fairgrounds too, just a few years ago, but people came on skis and sleds and drank cocoa and ate lunch. This year Holiday Market spaces sold out, completely. We've worked hard for this! Enjoy it.

### Beware of Counterfeit Money

We handle a lot of cash at Holiday Market. We had a few problems with counterfeit money at Saturday Market this year. Right now, we don't have any reports of counterfeit money in our area; however, you should always be on the lookout for fake money. Here are some tips:

- 1. Hold the bill up to the light.** Check for a holograph of the face on the bill plus the thin vertical strip containing the denomination. Also, make sure the watermark can be seen on both sides of the bill. There is a security thread imbedded from top to bottom on the face of the bill.
- 2. Color-shifting ink:** If you hold the new series bill (except the \$5 note) and tilt it back and forth, please observe the numeral in the lower right hand corner as its color shifts from green to black and back.
- 3. Comparison:** Test the feel and texture of the paper with other bills you know are authentic.

Feel free to ask your neighbors or come to Member Services if you are given a questionable bill. We have a test marker to use.

### Remove Tape, Please!

If you are in the same space for the entire show, help us out and pull your tape off the floor once you are sure you are in the right location. At the end of the Holiday Market, we are required to pull all the tape off of the floor and tape that has been in place for six weeks can be kind of hard to remove. Thanks for your help!

### Important Parking Info

Park your vehicle in the parking lot behind the building. The front parking lot is for customers. Don't leave anything in your car, as thefts do happen.

### Stock Must Be Removed

Remember that all stock must be removed from your booth by 9pm on Sunday night. If you are selling the next weekend, your booth structure and furniture may stay.
