
### 8th Ave. is Now Two-Way

Greetings Artisans,

TRAFFIC ANNOUNCEMENT: 8th Avenue traffic is indeed, two ways. Please follow traffic laws when loading and unloading and pulling in with the flow of traffic, NOT against. Pull your vehicle completely on the concrete, there should be ZERO loading/unloading on the asphalt. If your vehicle is too large to safely and effective load/unload from 8th Avenue, you should consider an alternative, or you will be asked to load/unload from another street. Also, please respect your fellow members time and needs. This means, 20 minutes loading/unloading and active communication with your neighbors.

Switching gears, I want to talk a bit about reintroducing our Saturday Market Sustainability program this year. We have promoted Morris Shuey (Site-Crew) as our Lead Recycler. Morris is passionate about recycling and composting, and is working on improving our sustainable practices for the entire Market. We have hired 2 recycler/composters to work with Morris (V and Christopher) who literally go through SM garbage sorting out recyclables, compostable materials and what we send to the land fill as waste, with the goal of significantly reducing our waste footprint. This is a labor of love and requires some pretty special workers! Your SM sustainability crew wears green crew shirts that say "Sustainability", so give them a smile, a shout out or ask them about the program (Morris loves to talk shop). Also, look around the Market and notice the sorting bins (with signs) and the fork buckets everywhere. Morris distributes durables (forks/spoons) to the Food Court participants every Saturday and collects them from the dirty fork buckets and/or rescues them from the garbage. He and V then wash, sterilize, and sort the durables after Market is closed at Erin's Table. Our new crew is simply amazing, and we know we will continue to improve on our sustainable practices.

Most artisans have a thin safety net for the life events that happen to all of us. We're so busy making and promoting our crafts that we have little time to think about things like retirement funds and savings...and we mostly do not have wageearning jobs that provide benefits.

The Kareng Fund is that safety net for any crisis that threatens your ability to work on your craft and earn your living. When a tree falls on your house, or your garage burns, or your car is broken into and your stock and displays are stolen, the KF can give you a cash grant with no strings attached.

The only requirements are that you are a member of an arts organization (like Market) and your income is less than 200% of the federal poverty level (\$15,064 for an individual, \$31,200 for a family of four in 2024, times two) and your crisis is a serious one. We don't have the means to help you pay your fees for last year's Holiday Market, or other ordinary expenses you have incurred, but if you are in crisis, we are here to help.

Applying is simple on our website, www.karengfund.org, and you can also donate there. There is a donation button on the bottom of the Saturday Market website as well. The easiest way to support your fellow artists is to round up your fees on your weekly envelope, or give an amount of your choosing each week or whenever you are feeling generous.

We are a community and supporting each other is one of the most important things we can do for our own ability to thrive. Giving feels good, and when it is your turn to be in need, you will feel good about accessing this essential resource. The Kareng Fund was formed so that we could actively, continuously care for each other. It is passing the hat in the form of a 501c3 Nonprofit that was formed and is governed by your friends and associates from Saturday Market. All of the nine volunteer directors have had a close association with Market and most of us sell next to you every week.

Please help us with your money. We've given over \$120,000 in grants the fifteen years since we bought someone a water heater in 2004. Thanks to all of you who have supported us in the past and continue to do so. Stay tuned for our Silent Auction at the Sustainability Rocks! Block Party on August 3<sup>rd</sup>.
