My grandmother was raised a poor farm girl in Missouri, then went on to raise 5 kids with a single paycheck that my hardworking grandfather provided. She didn't really have a choice about being resourceful. She had to save money in whatever way she could. I grew up watching her reuse cereal and bread bags as small garbage bags as well as cooking meals from scratch, and canning vegetables from the garden. She even re-gifted items that she no longer used. Her actions and beliefs are the reason I reuse cereal and bread bags, grow and cook vegetables for our table, and I have lately been regifting things.

She would be really proud of me for having worked for the past year with an amazing group of dedicated people (the Sustainabilty Committee, Market Staff and Site-Crew) to help bring back our durables and trash/recycling programs. However, one person came forward with Shannon's encouragement that provided the final puzzle piece for making these programs possible. I am talking about Morris Shuey, the Market's Lead Recycler. His passion for composting exceeds anyone I've ever met, so if you have questions about the programs, he's the guy. Together with his crew of Christopher and V, they provide the food court with clean, metal forks and sort through the trash/compost. They are the heart and soul of the Market's sustainable practices, so take time to thank them!

To celebrate the Market's commitment to sustainability, we are having our Sustainability Rocks Community Block Party on August 3rd. Customers will be encouraged to learn more about local sustainability practices and organizations, there will be a kid's art table provided by MECCA, and a kid's planting station provided by Market too. There will also be a treasure hunt, where customers will look for artisans with different sustainable practices. These members will be given a special sign for the event. Can you believe it's that time of year already? With time comes change, with change comes progress, which inevitably leads to more change. When it comes to our Market community, your Board, Committees and Staff are always looking to make our Market better and more successful for everyone.

This year there has been a lot of discussion between the Holiday Market Committee, Budget Committee and Board regarding how we can create equity for all booths spaces. Along with a flat fee increase this year, your Board decided to implement the same square footage rate for both halls and all booth spaces. For example, if you have an 8x8 booth in Evergreen Hall, your booth fee will increase a total of \$59 if you sign up for all seven selling blocks. You will see this increase on your postcards.

The equity discussion then turned to booth spaces that benefit from having more than one frontage space (booths with two or three selling sides). It is common practice that art festivals sell these spaces at a premium, because they allow the booth holder to make more money and many of us have enjoyed this additional space, at the same price as our single frontage neighbors. The Board approved an additional charge for booths with two or three frontage spaces.
